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LAST YEAR'S SCHOOL ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

1. Literacy in English, Literacy en Français – RWBB will adopt a successful balanced literacy program, thereby achieving a 10% increase in student performance for both English and French by June 2017

- ✓ Allotted time for grade group teachers (2-4) to discuss, once per cycle
- ✓ Used Instructional Lead teacher to improve classroom instruction
- ✓ Attended PD on Café 2C at SAGE
- ✓ Gave new teachers Daily 5 book and Café book

✓ Modeled/taught quality writing in Daily 5/ and used Regie Routman strategies and philosophy

- ✓ Held PLC meetings with writing as a focus
- ✓ Staff attended the Divisional P.D. workshops offered for writing
- ✓ Used strategies to drive instruction for authentic writing
- ✓ Created a folder to follow each child with reading, writing continuum

3. <u>Positive</u>, <u>Respectful Learning Behaviours</u>: To cultivate an inclusive and respectful environment for staff and students while continuing the implementation of restitution.

4. <u>Intellectual Engagement</u>: To increase student engagement and inquiry through diverse learning activities in classrooms, intersectional groups, and school wide.
